Activities

Reading is an activity. However, if a reader must look for an answer in order to continue the book's narrative, then we call this an activity.

In MINE, we refer as activities to these moments when readers prompt themselves outside of a linear reading to look for the answer that will allow them to continue the narrative. This answer might be in their understanding of the book or in their surroundings, such as looking for a clue on a photo (digital or physical).




Adding activities to a story increases the reader's immersion into the narrative, when it is done as integral part of the story. Furthermore, it can support the comprehension of different story aspects.

To add an activity into your story, locate yourself on the **Activity panel** . When the icon is blue  it means the activity panel is active

Multiple choice questions

It is a traditional approach to digital storytelling. Following are the steps to create a multiple choice question in MINE

a. Your page


Assure that your page layout (Edit panel , subpanel Layout ) supports text 

Your multiple choice questions should be allocated in the text area.

b. Multiple choice subpanel


The **Multiple choice** subpanel

Multiple choice

is located inside of **Activity panel**  Next follow the flow of the subpanel items.

1. Question

Write your question inside the “question text” field.

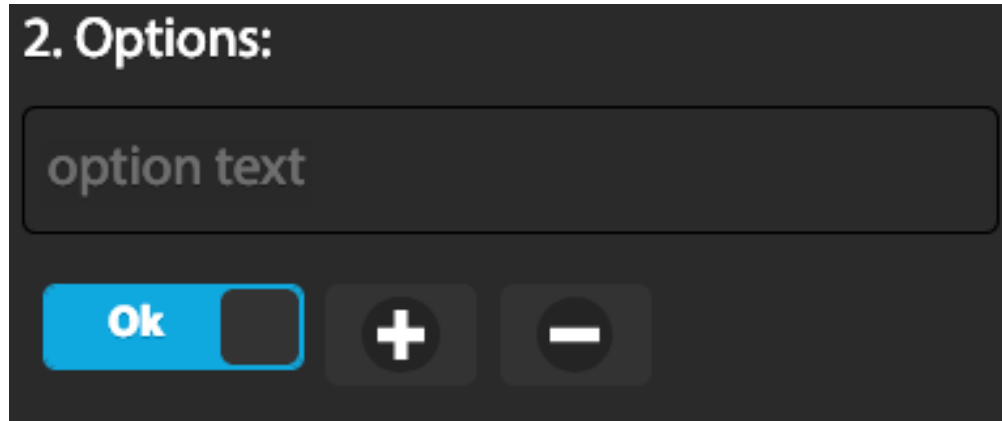


1. Question:

question text


2. Options


In this section, the author will write the potential answers for the question defined in point 1.



The answer is written in the field: “*option text*”

To indicate that the answer is correct leave the *Ok* button in blue 

If this option is not correct, change the status of the OK to No 

The  adds a block for a new answer.

The  eliminates that answer.

After all potential answers are displayed, then one should indicate how the progression for the next page is performed.

Progression to the next page after:

1st try

1st correct

3 tries

1st try. This option indicates that independently if the answer is correct or incorrect, because it was tried, the next page will appear.

1st correct. With this option, the next page will not appear before the correct answer is chosen.

3 tries. The readers should attempt at most 3 times to give the correct answer and then the next page will appear.

3. Feedback

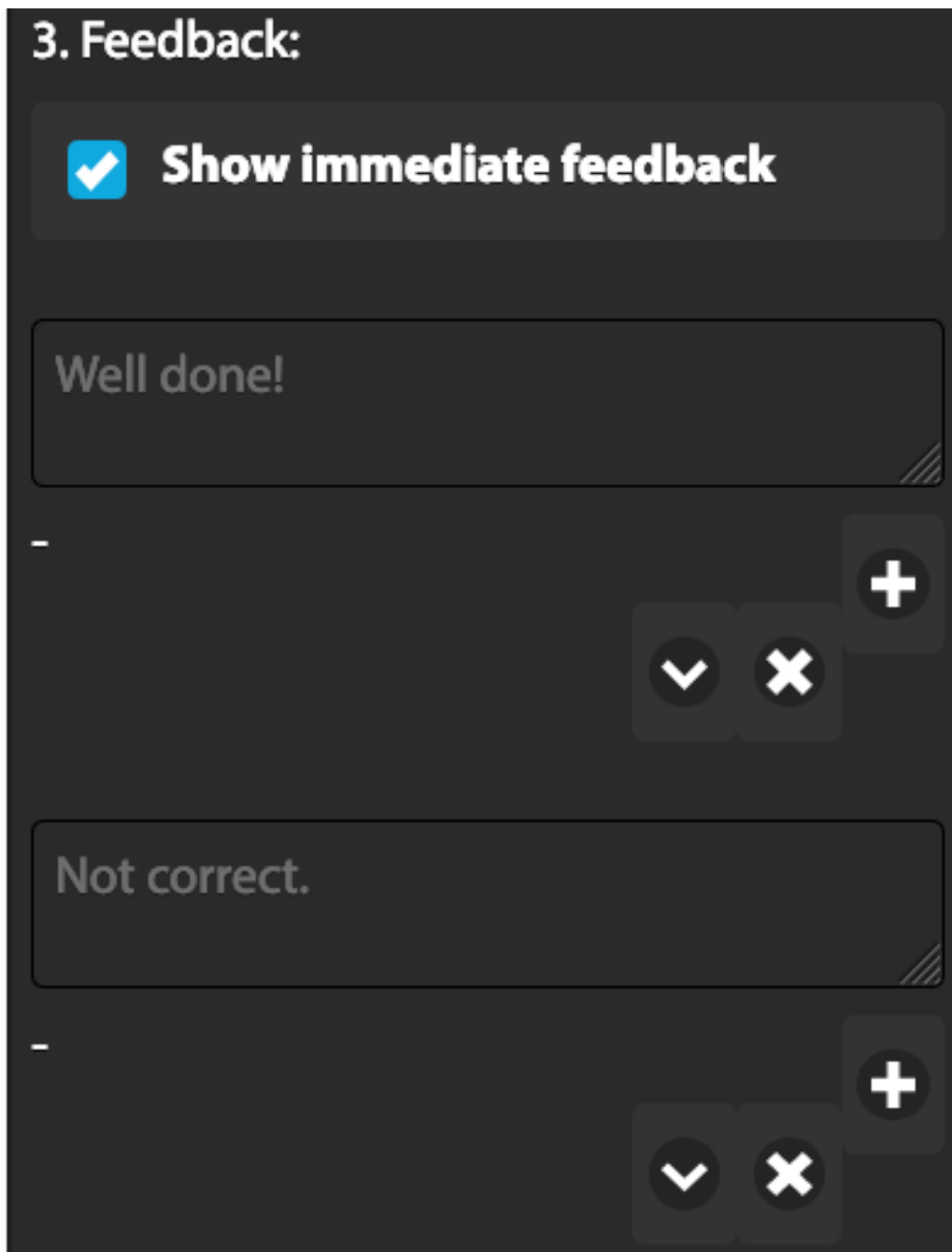
It is the information displayed after interaction with the multiple choice question according to the rules defined in the previous point (2).

If the author wants to have feedback activated



to show the feedback for correct or

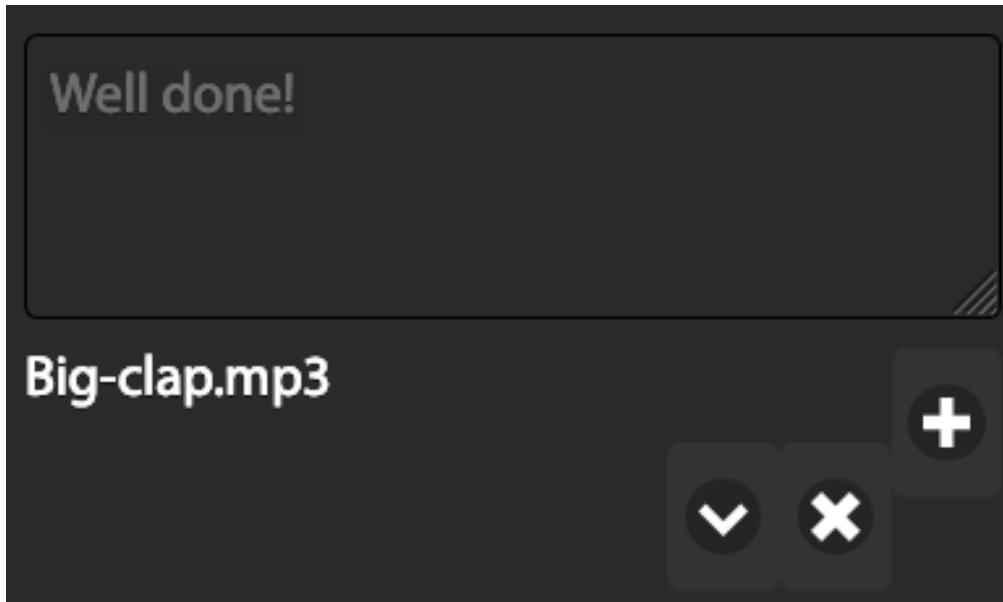
incorrect answers.




(i). When the answer is correct

The text that shows up right after the reader

clicks on a correct option of the multiple choice question, is the one the author writes in the text field “*Well done*” .



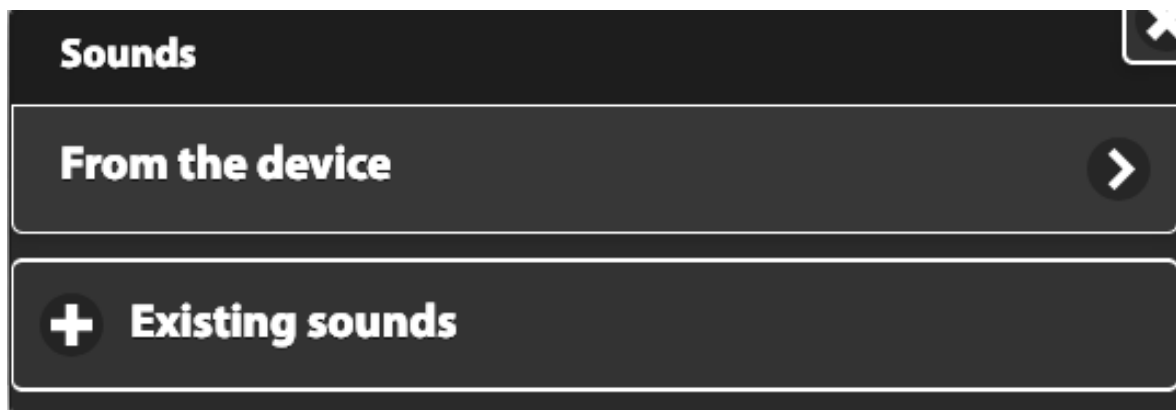
It is possible to also include sound. One can associate an audio to this feedback by clicking


the following button  . Next the author should select the sound to be associated to this feedback.


There are two options:

From the device- means the file is currently on the device you are utilising to write this story.

Existing sounds - points to the sounds you have already uploaded to this story and are automatically allocated in the sound library (in the Edit panel)



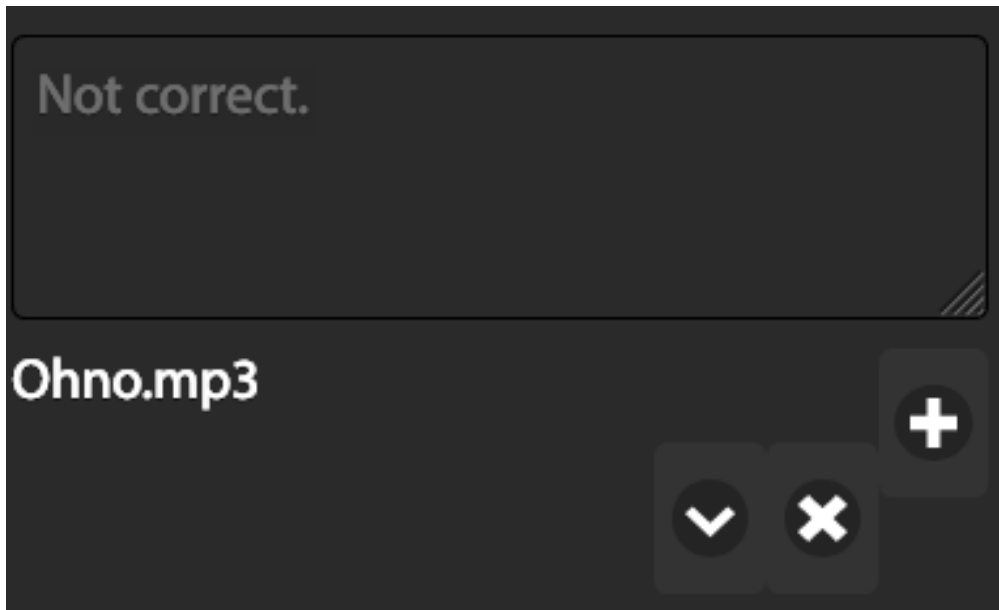
To dissociate the sound from this particular feedback click the button 

A short cut to upload a sound from a personal device is through the button 

(ii). When the answer is incorrect

The text that shows up right after the reader clicks on an incorrect option of the multiple choice question, is the one the author writes in

the text field “*No correct.*” .



It is possible to also include sound. Please read the section of sound on *(i) When answer is correct*

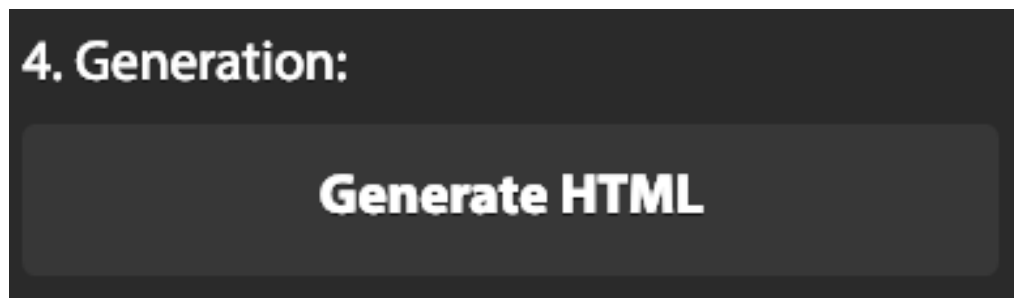
4. Generation

This button transfers all that you have prepared in this panel to the page. For this you need:

(i) put your cursor on the page where you want the multiple choice question to appear. It

has to be in a text section **T** other than the header.

(ii) click the button **Generate HTML**



How does it look?

After this action a text shows up on the page contained within the red rectangle. This text is the information you input in the multiple choice panel.

In our example, our text is:

What are the colors of
the Finnish flag?

blue and red

yellow and blue

blue and white

white and red

You knew the colors! No correct, look to the
flag of Finland

The question is:

What are the colors of the Finnish flag?

Potential answers:

- *blue and red*
- *yellow and blue*
- *blue and white*
- *white and red*

Feedback for the correct answer

You knew the colors!

Feedback for any incorrect answer:

Not correct, look at the flag of Finland

5. Modify the multiple choice question

If you want to modify an already generated multiple choice question that is located in the page, you need to:

- i. Put your cursor on the multiple choice question inside the red area
- ii. Modify the correction inside the **Multiple choice** subpanel. Once all the modifications are ready, then
- iii. click **Generate HTML** again to apply the changes
